Five New Members Join Land Trust Board

Jackson Hole, Wyoming – The Jackson Hole Land Trust is excited to welcome five new members to the Board of Directors: Bill Adams, Ann Frame, Mandy Mahoney, Scott Pierson and Jarad Spackman. Each of these community members brings unique professional and personal experiences to the board. The common bond that they all share is their love of the open spaces in this valley and a commitment to protecting its irreplaceable beauty and character for future generations.

Ann Frame has lived in Jackson for twenty years. She grew up in western Pennsylvania, attended Brown University, and earned an MBA from Wharton Business School. Before coming to Jackson she worked at Lazard Freres in asset management in New York City. Ann previously served on the board of the Land Trust from 2001 to 2007. Her unwavering commitment to preserving the open space in this community will once again be a welcome addition to board.
